What's Cookin'?

Breakfast Pizza

1 lb. pork sausage
1 pkg. crescent rolls
1 c. frozen hash brown potatoes, thawed
5 eggs
1/4 c. whole milk
1/2 tsp. salt
1/8 tsp. pepper
1 c. grated Cheddar cheese (sharp)
2 Tbsp. grated Parmesan cheese

Cook sausage in skillet until browned. Drain and rinse in a colander. Separate crescent dough into 8 triangles. Place in ungreased 12 inch pizza pan with points toward center. Press over bottom and up sides to form crust. Seal perforations. Spoon sausage over crust. Sprinkle with potatoes. Top with Cheddar cheese. Beat together eggs, milk, salt, and pepper. Pour into crust. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Bake at 375° for 25 to 30 minutes.
