Joseph Harold "Papa Joe" Chevalier

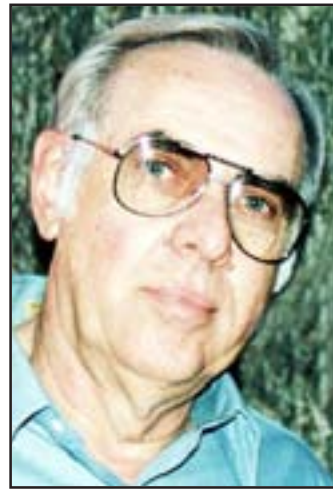
